Library News and Notes:

<u>Remarkably Bright Creatures</u> by Shelby Van Pelt (RP) A charming, witty, and compulsively readable exploration of friendship, reckoning, and hope that traces a widow's unlikely connection with a giant Pacific octopus. Named Best Book of summer by the Chicago Tribune.

<u>The Exchange</u> by John Grisham (LP) Fifteen years after the events of *The Firm*, Mitch and Abby are living in New York and Mitch is a partner in the largest law firm in the world. When his mentor in Rome asks him for a favor that will take him far from home, Mitch finds himself at the center of a sinister plot that has world-wide implications — and will endanger his colleagues, friends and family. Mitch has become a master at staying one step ahead of his adversaries; but this time, there is no place to hide.

<u>Presumed Guilty</u> by Scott Turow (LP) Once again we meet Rusty from Turow's blockbuster novel, <u>Presumed innocent</u>. Rusty is retired and attempting to start anew with his soon-to-be bride Bea, with whom he shares a restful lake home. But Rusty's peace evaporates when Aaron, Bea's son who is living under their supervision while on probation, disappears. Days later, Aaron shows up with a story about a camping trip with his girl, Mae. They had a fight and parted ways. Mae is later found dead. Aaron is arrested for murder and Rusty comes out of retirement to defend him.

<u>John Lewis</u> by David Greenberg (LP) Drawing on interviews with Lewis and over 250 others plus never-before-used FBI files and documents, this thoroughly researched and dramatically told biography traces Lewis's life from the Civil Rights years to his time in Congress where he came to be known as the "Conscience of the Congress."

<u>Founding Documents of the Constitution</u> by Government Printing Office (RP) Contents include a copy of The Constitution, Amendments to the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.


Shopping and Lunch at Mayfair Mall | Friday, Feb. 7th | Depart at 10:00am

Lunch Bunch - Parkside 23 Tuesday, February 25th | Bus departs at 11:30am


