East Side Neighborhood Associations to Host Candidate Forum for 2025

Third District Aldermanic Election. Six East Side Neighborhood Associations will host a Third District Aldermanic Candidate Forum on Tuesday, February 11 from 6:30—8:00 PM at St. Mark's Church, 2618 N. Hackett Avenue. Eight candidates will appear on the February 18 ballot in the race to serve as the new Third District Common Council member. This is an opportunity to learn more about the candidates running for the Third District Common Council Seat and where they stand on the issues important to voters in this district. The top two candidates will advance to a general election on April 1. This non-partisan special election was called after the recent death of Jonathon Brosthoff who won the seat in a special election on November 2022.
