**Dr. Tim Crain: Winston Churchill:** *Tuesday, March 25, 7:00 p.m. in the Astor Room.* During this 6-part series, Dr. Crain explores the remarkable life of Winston Churchill. From his early years in the British Army to his leadership during WWII, Churchill's resilience, eloquence, and strategic mind helped shape the course of history. **Part II: The Empire and Churchill:** As a member of the aristocratic class, Churchill would be most apt to enter a life of political service like his father Lord Randolph Churchill, or a life of military service. Initially he chose a military life attending Sandhurst Military Academy, yet he also remained very interested in politics. His travels throughout the British Empire, especially to South Africa during the Boer War, made him a household name in Britain by the early 20th Century.
