# **Library News and Notes:**

The following books will be added to the library for the month of August:

A Most Tolerant Little Town by Rachel Louise Martin (RP): A masterful and striking portrait of a small town living through tumultuous times, this propulsive piece of forgotten civil rights history — detailing the first school to attempt court-ordered desegregation in the wake of Brown v. Board of Education — will forever change how you think of the end of racial segregation in America.

<u>Waiting Together — Hope and Healing for Families of Prisoners</u> by Carol Kent (RP): Donated by Deacon Tom Hunt, who spoke about his prison ministry last month, this book is authored by a mother whose only son is serving a life sentence for murder. Kent doesn't ask for sympathy for her son but describes the daily impact that a prisoner's crime has on their families. Through reflections, prayers, and scripture passages, she offers hope and healing for families struggling through similar situations.

A Calamity of Souls by David Baldacci (RP): Set in the tumultuous year of 1968 in southern Virginia, a racially charged murder case sets a duo of white and Black lawyers against a deeply unfair system as they work to defend their wrongfully accused Black defendants in this courtroom drama from #1 New York Times best-selling author David Baldacci.

**Death Stalks Door County 7-BOOK SERIES** by Patricia Skalka (RP): Find all seven of these Door County murder mysteries in the Local Authors section of the library (denoted by green stickers on the spine). These captivating mysteries follow Dave Cubiak, a former Chicago homicide detective turned Door County park ranger. In order, the books are: Death Stalks Door County (2014); Death at Gills Rock (2015) Death in Cold Water (2016); Death Rides the Ferry (2018); Death by the Bay (2019); Death Washes Ashore (2021); Death Casts a Shadow (2022).
